- III. Invocation. The invocation was given by Mayor Hayes.
- IV. Pledge of Allegiance was recited in unison.

- VII. Agenda Items:

1. LCPC Mrs. Lori Parks

Presented 2025-38-W. Conditional Use for Victory Baptist Church. A conditional use request was Submitted by Phillip and Robin Townsend, on behalf of owner Pastor Alan Stewart with the Victory Baptist Church, for an adult day care at 1933 Talmadge Road. The property sits on 2.06 acres and is Described as LCTM Parcel 052B011. The request has been properly advertised. Devine Trinity's Day Program will operate Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM-2:00 PM. The staff will arrive each day at 7:30 AM to receive individuals for the day. The program will provide community integration, art and craft and various games. There will be a nurse on staff to provide counseling and first aid." LCPC voted to approve with conditional uses such as:

- 1. The use shall not adversely affect the economic values, or the physical appearance of the neighborhood or area surround the site or lot in question.
- 2. The use shall not be consistent with with the comprehensive plan and with the purpose and intent of the land use district.
- 3. The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the use shall not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety or general welfare.
- 4. The use will not create an undue burden on transportation, including streets and transit, schools, utilities, or the provisions of public safety.
- 5. The design shall minimize adverse physical and environmental effects on adjacent properties, including adverse visual impacts. Buffer zones, where necessary to shield any adverse factors, such be considered. There are not proposed exterior renovations.
- 6. Additional space for parking, landscaping, and adequate measures for ingress and egress shall be considered if necessary to protect adjacent structures or lots from any adverse impact. The motion to approve with LCPC's conditional use was made by Councilmember Boston and the second was added by Mayor Pro Tem Lovette.

2. LCPC Mrs. Lori Parks

Presented 2025-40 A & W Conditional Use Request by Con Sabor Borioua, LLC. Mr. Raul Rios submitted a request for an outdoor event venue at 4850 West Oglethorpe Highway in the Town of Allenurst and City of Walthourville. Property is 9.15 and is further described as LCTM Parcel 050B05.

The request was publicly advertised, and Mayor Pro Tem Lovette led the discussion, by stating," we have asked you all not to advertise until we (Elected Body) approve. Mr. Boriou stated he is only familiar with one incident and that was due to miscommunication. The question arose about alcohol being served and having alcohol on the premises. The Elected Body stated there have been several times there were events and alcohol have been served. Mr. Rios stated alcohol is not sold by him, oftentimes citizens (patrons) bring it in with them. The Mayor and Council stated they needed to revisit this item later, because alcohol can pose a liability. To serve alcohol on premises there are State requirements that must be met. They want to compile more research on the topic of alcohol. However, due to a special event that will be held before the Mayor and Council can reconvene they are approving the request temporarily based on the Conditional recommendations of LCPC which are:

- 1. The use shall not adversely affect the economic values or the physical appearance of the neighborhood or areas surrounding the site or lot in question.
- 2. The use shall be consistent with the comprehensive plan, and with the purpose and intent of the land use district, this property is designated as mixed-use urban corridor and commercial in both the Town of Allenhurst and the City of Walthourville.
- 3. The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the use shall not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety or general welfare.

Also, LCPC's Special Condition Recommendations are:

- 1. The property owner shall obtain a business license from the City of Walthourville and Town of Allenhurst. Violations of any of the special conditions herein shall render the business licenses void.
- 2. Food trucks or other individual vendors at the events shall have a valid business license.
- 3. Security shall be provided by a private security firm properly licensed by the GA Board of Private Detective and Security Agencies for all events. Local law enforcement may be hired to provide security at the expense of the event organizer.

- 4. Events shall only be permitted between 10 AM and midnight (12 AM). Event setup and takedown may be allowed one hour before and after these times. SLCPC Special Conditions.
- 5. Events shall have licensed traffic control personnel directing traffic on E. Oglethorpe Highway. Local law enforcement may be hired to provide traffic control at the expense of the event organizer.
- 6. No alcohol shall be sold on the premises
- 7. No activity or displays shall be allowed in front of the concrete wall. This does not extend to temporary signage on the wall which shall not require a permit, but which shall not be installed any earlier than 2 weeks before the advertised event and shall be removed within 2 days of the end of the event.
- 8. At least 21 days prior to a scheduled event, the City of Walthourville and the Town of Allenhurst shall be notified of the pending event. Such notification shall be on a form provided by either municipality and may require signatures from local officials including by not limited to the Allenhurst Mayor, and the Walthourville Mayor, City Clerk, Police Chief and Fire Chief.
- 9. The City of Walthourville and the Town of Allenhurst reserve the right, on an event-by-event basis, to require proof of any of the above requirements or impose additional requirements for the event. The municipalities also reserve the right to deny subsequent events by an event organizer if there were violations at any of their previous events. LCPC Special Conditions
- 10. Prior to the first event, documentation shall be provided indicating either GDOT does not require any improvements to the existing access of property or, if they do, the property is in compliance with the requirements. Local review may be required. The motion to approve was made by Councilmember Kelly and the second was added by Councilmember Boston.

 Vote: 4-1: Motion Passed.

Opposed: Councilmember Underwood.

3. LCPC Mrs. Lori Parks

Presented a Business License Request for Premier Venues and Events. The owner is Mr. Paul Rios, Jr. He is applying for a Business License to hold events at 4850 West Oglethorpe Highway. The property will be used to host a variety of outdoor events such as festivals, car shows, concerts and private events. The property is zoned C-3 for Highway Commercial. The motion to approve was made by Mayor Pro Tem Lovette and the second was added by Councilmember Kelly.

Vote: 4-1: Motion Passed: Opposed Councilmember Underwood.

4. LCPC Mrs. Lori Parks

Presented a One Time Event Permit for Barbers in the Field. The business owner is Khari Collins and this is a networking event for Barbers. The event will be held on November 8th and 9th, 2025 and there will be no alcohol sold on premises for this event. The organizer let it be known that they cannot control what someone will bring in (alcohol) in their private vehicles. Councilmember Boston added that he thinks it is crazy to for alcohol to be served (citizens bringing it in privately) versus alcohol being sold. Councilmember Underwood stated he has a problem when some was selling alcohol, and they told the Council they would not be selling it. He added this poses a real problem for him when he finds out. Mayor Hayes asked the council what did they want to do? They suggested approving the event and the Council will come back and revisit the topic of selling alcohol. The motion to approve was made by Councilmember Dodd and the second was added by Councilmember Underwood.

Vote: 5-0: Motion Passed Unanimously.

5. LCPC Mrs. Lori Parks

Presented a One-Time Event Permit for a Haunted Field Event. The business owner is Khari Collins and this event will be held on October 31, 2025 and it is a controlled environment for the youth to enjoy the

night of Halloween. There will be a costume contest, a haunted field, a live DJ, vendors, and a dunking booth and giveaways. The motion to approve was made by Councilmember Dodd and the second was added by Councilmember Kelly.

Vote: 5-0: Motion Passed Unanimously.

6. City of Walthourville

Mayor and Council

Millage Public Hearings. The city will implement a millage for 2026. Mayor Hayes asked the City Clerk to provide an update on the millage. Ms. Moss stated that the city has been in constant communication with Liberty County's Tax Commissioners' Office. Commissioner Sharp and his Team are working on the Tax Digest and they are about 98% complete. She stated the city will have to hold three public hearings to satisfy State Requirements. She anticipates the Tax Digest will be received this week. She stated time is critical because Liberty County must have the information by November 20th, 2025, to approve at their Commissioners Meeting. She has worked on a time calendar for the city to satisfy the requirements. She posed the following:

- Millage Ads will appear in October 23, 2025, Edition of the Coastal Courier.
- The First Public Hearing will need to be 7 (seven) days after that time frame. The City will hold a Halloween Event on October 30th; therefore, no public hearing will be held.
- ➤ Millage Public Hearing # 1 November 3, 2025 @ 6:00 PM Walthourville Fire Department
- Millage Public Hearing # 2 November 10, 2025 @ 11:00 AM Walthourville Fire Department
- Millage Public Hearing # 3 November 10, 2025 @ 6:00 PM Walthourville Fire Department

The regular meeting of the Mayor and Council will begin at 7:00 PM with the millage being on the agenda for adoption. Ms. Moss added that she will send the Mayor and Council an invite as a reminder for the meetings. These advertisements will be posted in the Coastal Courier, and on the city's website.

7. City of Walthourville

Councilmember Mitchell Boston

Councilmember Boston stated Public Works have faced challenges over the past year and outsourcing the department will yield improved service to the constituents, it will reduce long term cost, and it will increase the productivity. Mayor Hayes asked, "What will we do during a natural disaster? She added currently we have our own department, and they come in and assist or they stay late." Councilmember Dodd added, "I don't think we should get rid of Public Works, we don't need to make another bill, and we have a situation like we have with Atlantic Waste." Mayor Pro Tem added, "the employees need to be held accountable. Councilmember Boston added he feels the city should at least move forward and obtain proposals if they don't want to act on the proposal. Councilmember Kelly added that she supported proceeding with the RFP. The motion to proceed with the RFP was made by Councilmember Kelly and the second was added by Mayor Pro Tem Lovette.

IX. Citizens Comments:

Walthourville Citizens

1. Ms. Patience Wright stated she wanted to bring something to the Elected Officials' attention and began by reading the following:

Good evening council members and citizens. I am here to speak about my disappointment with one of the council members that represent our town. On September 24th at approximately 7:25 AM, my sister was involved in a car accident with Councilman Mitchell Boston. But, first, I would like to speak about my sister. She has been a resident of Walthourville for 30 years. She proudly serves as a teacher in the Liberty County School System and was humbly awarded teacher of the year for her school this year after many years of service in our system. That morning, on her way to work to serve her students, Mr. Mitchell Boston wrongfully side swiped my sister with his car. The police were called for assistance where Mr. Boston remained quiet on what truly happened that morning as he was the one obviously at fault. While my sister was being wrongfully given her citation, Mr. Boston then

proceeds to brag to a concerned family member that has stopped by that "I'm glad that it wasn't my classic '64 Cadillac. This car here, I don't really care about" referencing his new dark Hunter Green Tundra Pick Up truck. While the actions of that day cannot be changed, I am here to express my disappointment, disgust, and distrust for a person who supposedly represents me as a citizen of Walthourville. If he cannot be honest and truthful in matters outside of the council room, I certainly do not trust this person to make decisions for the people that he represents. Thank you for your time. Patience Wright.

2. Pastor Goosby stated he was the Pastor of Pleasant Hill Holiness Church. He stated he was here because of the increase in his bill. He came to City Hall and talked to Mr. Patrick Golphin. Mr. Golphin explained that the bill was increased because of the \$150.00 a month Fire Fee the church was being charged. He stated just last year they were paying \$25.00 monthly and now they are being charged this excessive fee. He added his church membership is small, and they are only at the church twice weekly on Sundays for service and Wednesdays for Bible Study. He also added the city could be a better job of informing the citizens of this increase. Councilmember Underwood remembered and reminded everyone that the city mailed letters to all citizens, and the information was placed on the city's website and Facebook page. The Mayor informed him the city would be revising the Fire Fee during their budget workshops.

X. Department Comments

Water Department Had no report.

Mr. Patrick Golphin

Fire Department

Chief Nicolas Maxwell Chief Maxwell gave the departments statistics consisting of 35 Total Calls. 26 medical, 4 vehicle crashes, 1 fire and 2 Miscellaneous Fire Calls. He also urged citizens as the weather gets cooler, please be mindful of space heaters and gas heaters.

Police Department Chief Christopher Reed

Chief Reed gave the department's statistics and stated the department has answered 241 calls since September 23rd. He added on September 30th a suspicious death occurred in the City and the GBI and Liberty County Sheriff's Department is leading the investigation. He also warned citizens to please lock their car doors and night and to remove all weapons from their vehicles. Neighborhood Watch will be on October 23, 2025, at 6:30 PM and the topic will be Domestic Violence. On October 30, 2025, the City will host a Trunk-a-Treat Event from 6:00 PM-8:00 PM in the parking lot at City Hall. Today, October 14, the Police Department went to Liberty County Pre-K to visit the preschoolers. Councilmember Underwood thanked the Police Department for their patrol of the Bus Stops.

XI. Mayor's Update

Mayor Sarah B. Hayes

Mayor Hayes showed the council the booklet from the Planning Workshop that she attended on September 25th and 26th in St. Simons. She reported on November 15th, Keep Liberty Beautiful will be having a Recycle/Shred Event. The Shred Truck will be located at the Midway Complex and citizens can turn in old medications. She reiterated that Early Voting began today and FLOST/TSPLOST is on the ballot.

XII. **Elected Officials Comments**

Mayor Pro Tem Lovette stated she recommends when someone is speaking that they approach the podium.

Councilmember Mitchell Boston stated the job as a councilmember is to make life better for the citizens. He understands the frustration of the citizens. The Fire Fee is not a punishment; it is intact to assist the Fire Department. He is not here for personal gain, he is here to serve, he takes pride in serving with integrity.

Councilmember Kelly stated within the pass few weeks she has been approached by many citizens about the city. Therefore, to answer their questions, she is having a sit down on Friday October 17th from 6:00 PM-7:30 PM at the Liberty County College and Career Academy to address and answer questions. She also spoke with Jame Moore, LLC and they stated they should have the audits completed by end of year. The invoices for payment will be sent after the year is finished. Mayor Hayes informed her she would not be able to attend the Friday meeting due to just finding out about the meeting, she has a family commitment.

Councilmember Patrik Underwood stated we (city) need to draft an ordinance for dogs. A dog messed up a lady's fence. Attorney Moses stated this is a private matter and he feels the city does not need an ordinance and that the city should not get involved, the citizen should contact Magistrate Court for a resolution.

Councilmember Dodd had no comments.

XIII. Executive Session: At 7:54 PM a motion to enter Executive Session for personnel was made by Councilmember Kelly and the second was added by Councilmember Boston.


